To Parents: This activity is designed to help your child differentiate between various colors and shapes. Have your child draw a line from each example umbrella on the left to the one it matches on the right.

**Example**

- Yellow umbrella with yellow dots
- Green umbrella with yellow ducks
- Blue umbrella with a white grid pattern
- Orange umbrella with white flowers

- Boy in blue holding a yellow umbrella with yellow dots
- Girl in orange holding a pink and white striped umbrella with white rabbits
- Girl in pink holding a green umbrella with yellow ducks
- Boy in green holding a blue umbrella with a white grid pattern
- Girl in yellow holding a purple umbrella
- Girl in red holding an orange umbrella with white flowers



# Let's Match the Picnic Items





